# **RESOLUTION #1906-01**

### RESOLUTION UPDATING BUFFER COMPLIANCE PLAN

WHEREAS, Stearns County SWCD is obligated under Minnesota statute and rules to establish and implement a plan to ensure ongoing landowner compliance with the Buffer Law; and

**WHEREAS**, Resolution #1901-01 established a buffer compliance plan which this resolution replaces in its entirety;

**THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that the Stearns County SWCD adopts the following buffer compliance plan:

# **Buffer Law Compliance Implementation Plan**

- 1. COMPLIANCE TRACKING OF ALL PARCELS SUBJECT TO THE BUFFER LAW AT LEAST ONCE EVERY 3 YEARS.
  - a. Review all parcels once every 3 years using most recent aerial imagery available and/or a site visit with landowner.

## 2. RANDOM SPOT CHECKS (aerial or on-site)

- a. The SWCD will review parcels of emphasis yearly. Examples:
  - 1. Previously non-compliant
  - 2. No-till, cover cropped
  - 3. Altered buffer width (alternative practice)
  - 4. Cost-shared funds (year 1,5,9)

#### 3. PROCESS TO HANDLE COMPLAINTS

- a. Upon noticed complaint, SWCD will verify if parcel is on DNR buffer map and reference any existing documentation.
- b. SWCD will determine compliance per the determination procedure below.
- c. Identity of complainant may be public information.

#### 4. COMPLIANCE DETERMINATIONS

- a. Compliance determination will be completed using the most recent aerial imagery available and/or a site visit with landowner.
  - 1. If non-compliant, proceed to 5. Non-Compliance Process (below)
- b. Compliance will be tracked using BuffCAT or other interactive mapping system.
- c. Unless previously non-compliant, no additional record of compliance will be maintained in the SWCD office.

d. The SWCD may issue a Validation of Compliance if requested by landowner, dated from day of aerial imagery or site visit.

#### 5. NON-COMPLIANCE PROCESS

- a. If a review of aerial imager and/or site visit indicates a parcel is out of compliance, SWCD staff will document the findings and begin non-compliance proceedings
  - 1. Documentation of non-compliance status
    - a. Aerial imagery and/or photos
    - b. Staff name, date and method of inspection
    - c. Extent of non-compliance
    - d. Other information deemed relevant
- b. Upon determination of non-compliance, SWCD staff will contact landowner of record from current Stearns County parcel records via certified mail.
  - 1. A description of the non-compliance, including aerial imagery used and any other relevant documentation, will be sent to the landowner.
  - 2. An explanation of status required to get into compliance.
  - 3. Timelines and enforcement procedures.
- c. Landowner will be given 30 days contact the SWCD office to contest non-compliance determination or begin compliance.
  - 1. If landowner does not contact the SWCD within 30 days
    - a. SWCD staff will inform SWCD Board at next scheduled Board Meeting.
    - b. Upon notification and approval of SWCD Board, Notification of Noncompliance will be sent to the Watershed District and/or BWSR.
  - 2. If landowner contacts the SWCD within 30 days and refuses to comply:
    - a. SWCD staff will inform SWCD Board at next scheduled Board Meeting.
    - b. Upon notification and approval of SWCD Board, Notification of Noncompliance will be sent to the Watershed District and/or BWSR.
  - 3. If landowner contacts the SWCD within 30 days, contests non-compliance or seeks to get into compliance, and permits a site visit:
    - a. SWCD staff may determine parcel is compliant based on the site visit.
    - b. If non-compliance is confirmed, proceed to item **5c.2** (above) or **5d** (below) as appropriate.
- d. SWCD may provide technical assistance to the landowner to achieve compliance.
  - 1. A timeline and other requirements for buffer establishment consistent with Buffer Law guidelines will be set by the SWCD.
    - a. If landowner does not come into compliance within the given timeline, SWCD staff will inform SWCD Board at next scheduled Board Meeting.
    - b. Upon notification and approval of SWCD Board, Notification of Noncompliance will be sent to the Watershed District and/or BWSR.
  - 2. Financial assistance may only be available for structural (engineered) improvements to address concentrated flow or gullies.

- e. Once Notification of Noncompliance has been submitted to the Watershed District and/or BWSR, all relevant reports, evidence, and other data may be shared with those organizations for enforcement purposes.
- f. If Stearns County elects to enforce the Minnesota Buffer Law at a later date, all references to 'Watershed District and/or BWSR' above will be interpreted to include Stearns County.
